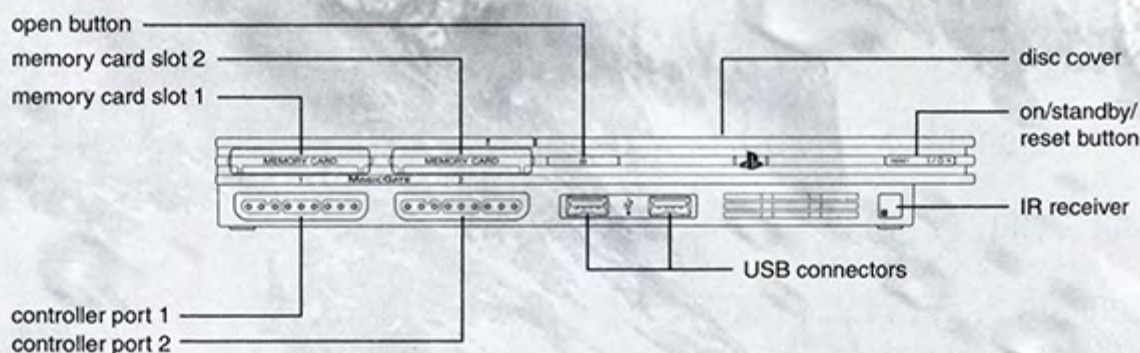
HANDLING YOUR PLAYSTATION®2 FORMAT DISC:

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GETTING STARTED



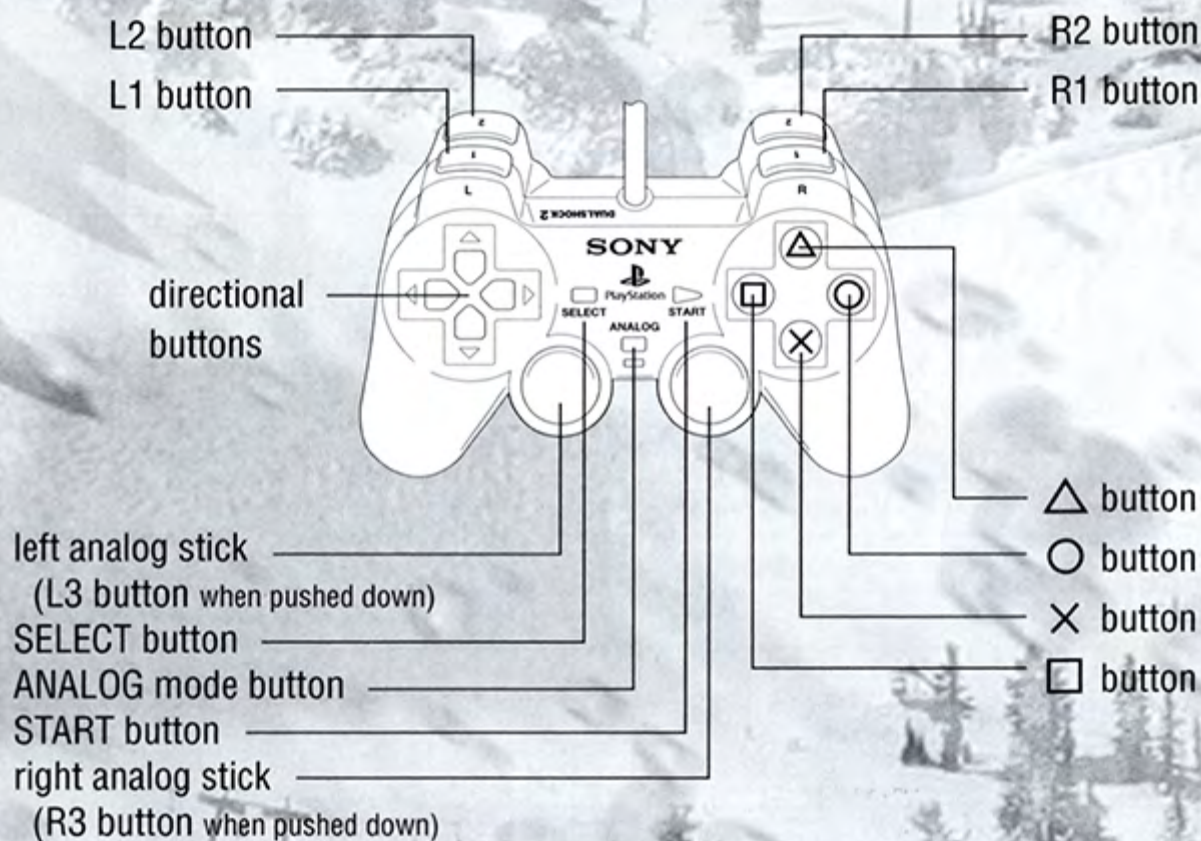
Set up your PlayStation® 2 computer entertainment system according to the instructions supplied with your system. Check that the system is turned on (the on/standby indicator is green). Insert the Shaun White Snowboarding disc in the system with the label side facing up. Attach game controllers and other peripherals as appropriate. Follow the on-screen instructions and refer to this manual for information on using the software.

Memory Card (8MB)(for PlayStation® 2)

To save game settings and progress, insert a memory card (8MB)(for PlayStation® 2) into MEMORY CARD slot 1 of your PlayStation® 2 system. You can load saved game data from the same memory card or any memory card (8MB)(for PlayStation® 2) containing previously saved games.

Pick your "You" before you go! Before playing, you'll need to create a Profile to store all your stuff!



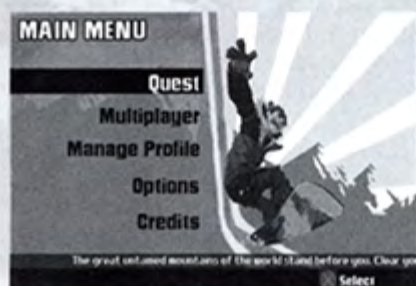
Choose Your Rider

GAMEPLAY

Only the masterful execution of four wildly different skills can conquer these slopes. As you gain skill, you unlock greater challenges and bigger mountains, until it all culminates in the ultimate challenge. Do you have what it takes?



Speed

Speed's just what it sounds like. Press the **▲** button to tuck, and go! The longer you stay in Speed State, the more points you accrue, but watch out – steering is harder when you're zooming down the mountain.



Trick

As you approach the lip of a kicker, press the **×** button and release at the perfect moment to execute a big jump. Pressing one of the directional buttons or the analog stick at the same time spins you or flips you.



The L2 and R2 buttons correspond to your left and right hands, and the **▲**, **■**, **◎**, and **×** buttons correspond to locations on your board.

Make sure you give yourself enough time to land!

Slide

Use the directional buttons or analog stick to rotate and execute the trick, and the L2 and R2 buttons to balance.



Slide Tricks List

Here's how to do each of the slide tricks. The more tricks you can perform during a slide, the better your score will be, so rotate on the rail, balance on your nose and tail, and see how many tricks you can fit in one slide! Careful, however: each trick makes it a little harder to balance.

Carve

Alternating the R2 button and L2 button sends you into deep, rhythmic turns. For that extra jolt of adrenaline (and extra points as well!) see how close you can get to the obstacles in your path as you carve! Hold a turn for too long, however, and you may take a tumble and lose it all!



Focus

As you ride, you immerse yourself more and more deeply into what you're doing, gaining Focus. Each time you change from one State into another, you gain a little bit of Focus.

Focus Power is a way for you to score higher on your actions by multiplying points. Triggering Focus is totally under your control – think tactically, and choose when to use it. **Each time that you level up all your skills, a new Focus Level becomes available!**

Changing from Speed to Slide back to Speed is fine, but change to each of the four Skills to maximize your Focus gain:

Once your Focus bar is full, you can activate it by pressing the R1 button. Activating your Focus bar increases your points for the duration it's active!

Pause Menu

Resume

This option returns you to gameplay.

Restart Slope

Restart your ride from the top and improve your most recent score.

Slope Info

Get a quick reminder of what you have to do on this ride.

Options

Sound: Adjust Sound Effect and Music volume.

Trick List: A little refresher on the tricks!

Note: The game automatically saves your preferences to your Profile as you return to the Main Menu.

Quit

Exit to the Main Menu.

The Trek to the Top

When you start the game, only the first slope on the first mountain is available. As you complete each objective, more of the mountain opens up. Then what do you do? Completing Slope Objectives, getting at least one star in each of the Specific Challenges, and collecting a Golden Crown allows you to progress and enter the next mountain.

Slope Objectives

Okay! When you start a new run, you may notice some empty bars in the top right corner. To complete the slope, your goal is to fill all those bars in one run.

At first, you may only need to fill one bar, like the Speed bar. As you progress, more than one objective has to be completed at once, so you need to strategize, pick your line, and show your versatility!

Specific Challenges

Specific Challenges are goals that are separate from the main Slope Objective, and vary wildly. Maybe you'll be asked to do tricks on a speed slope, maybe you'll just need to get to the bottom without falling once. Achieving one Star level on the Specific Challenge completes the next mountain requirement, and reaching two or even three stars unlocks new boards! You still need to buy a board with XP once it becomes available. You do not necessarily need to complete the slope objective and specific challenge in the same run.



Golden Crowns

There's a limited number of Golden Crowns on each slope. Collecting the number requested is one of the requirements to open up the next mountain! Collecting all of them unlocks little surprises as well, so it's always worth it!

Experience

With every run, you earn experience points, or XP. You earn a different kind of XP with each successful execution of a skill action. Speed actions earn Speed XP, Carve actions earn Carve XP, Slide actions earn Slide XP, and Trick actions earn Trick XP. You can use XP to upgrade your skills or buy boards.



Earning XP

Every time you complete a run, you have the chance to earn XP. Even if you fail the slope objective, you can still earn XP. You can ride slopes to gain XP in different skills than the one called for in the main Objective. Therefore, it's always a good idea to finish your run, even if you don't think you'll make your goals.

Spending XP

There are two ways to use your XP. You can upgrade your skill, which is a permanent change but costs quite a lot, or you can buy an unlocked board. Buying a board is much less expensive, but it only gives the effect determined by the board, and only when the rider has that board equipped.



Upgrading Skills

Upgrading skills spends your XP on permanent level upgrades. Upgrading your level in a certain skill is expensive, but allows you to permanently ride faster, jump higher, balance better, or execute carve quicker. Go back and ride previously completed slopes after an upgrade to collect more XP or conquer challenges you couldn't quite reach before!



Buying Boards

Buying new boards is much less expensive, and can give a “quick fix” solution when you are having trouble reaching an objective. You unlock new boards by achieving two or three stars level during specific challenges, and you buy them using your XP in the different skills.

MULTIPLAYER



Starting a Multiplayer Game

First you select Multiplayer from the Main Menu. Then decide on the mode you want to play; Cooperative or Competitive.

Cooperative Mode

In Cooperative mode, two players work together to conquer the slope objectives. You and your friend can decide slope objectives, choosing from the slopes available.



Competitive Mode

Select your slope objectives, then play!

The winner is the one who wins more of the selected objectives. In other words, if there are three total slope objectives, you win two, and your friend wins one, you win. If you tie, the player with the highest overall points gained wins.

TIPS AND TRICKS

- Switch from skill to skill! Why just ride when you could be carving or tucked into a speed state? Every bit of XP helps, and it builds up your Focus Meter!
- Explore the mountain! You never know what you might find.
- Change your grabs during a jump; multiple tricks bring big points.
- In Speed and Carve modes, change skills or stop occasionally to save your points! Don't forget that falling down loses it all!
- It's worth finishing the run even if you miss your objective; you earn XP you can use to buy boards or upgrade your skills!
