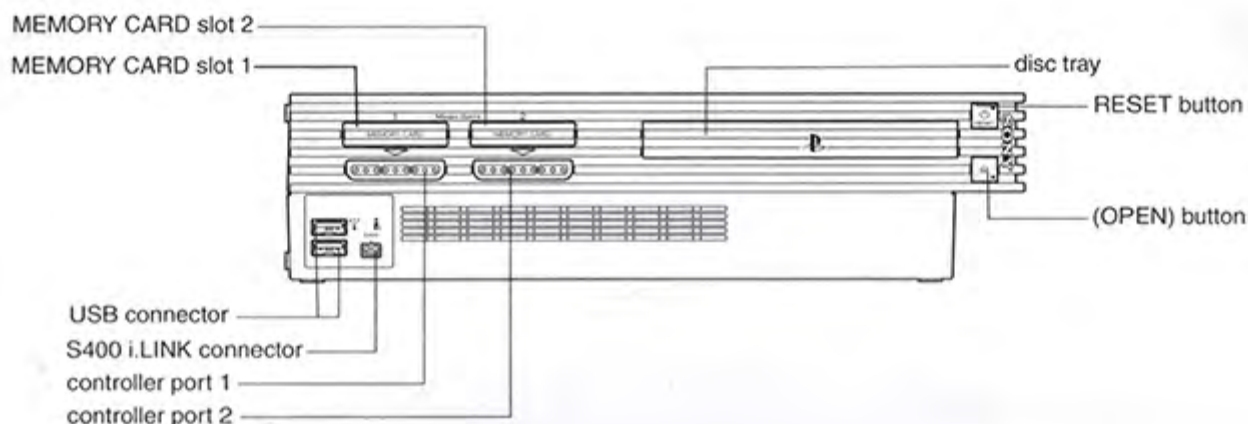
HANDLING YOUR PLAYSTATION 2 FORMAT DISC:

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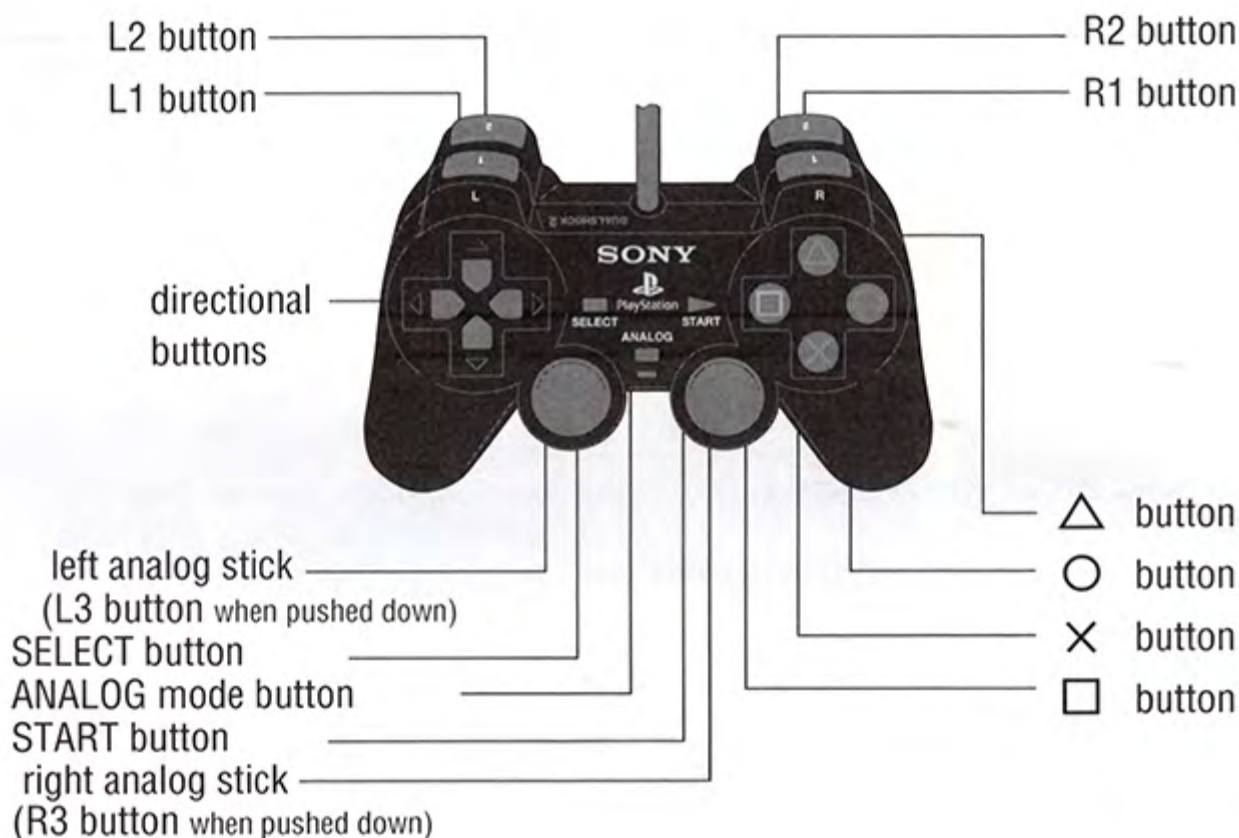
GETTING STARTED



Set up your PlayStation®2 computer entertainment system according to the instructions in its Instruction Manual. Make sure the MAIN POWER switch (located on the back of the console) is turned on. Press the RESET button. When the power indicator lights up, press the open button and the disc tray will open. Place the Tokyo Xtreme Racer™ 3 disc on the disc tray with the label side facing up. Press the open button again and the disc tray will close. Attach game controllers and other peripherals, as appropriate. Follow on-screen instructions and refer to this manual for information on using the software.

STARTING UP

DUALSHOCK®2 ANALOG CONTROLLER CONFIGURATIONS



RACING CONTROLS

Left analog stick and directional buttons = Steer car left/right

X button = Accelerate

□ button = Brake

○ button = Reverse

△ button = Change view

L1 button = Shift Down

L2 button = Brief rear view

L3 button = Horn

R1 button = Shift Up

R2 button = High beam

R3 button = Hazards

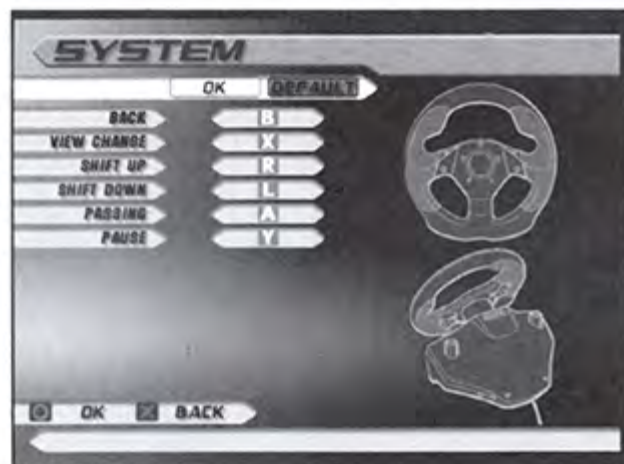
Left analog stick = Left/Right steers / pressing activates horn

Right analog stick = Left/Right turns on blinkers / pressing activates hazard lights.

START button = Pause

SELECT button = Turbo

STEERING WHEEL



B button = Back

X button = Change view

R button = Shift up

L button = Shift down

A button = Passing/Challenge

Y button = Pause menu

MODE SELECTION

You can select any option in the Mode Select Menu. Use the directional buttons/left analog stick or steering wheel to highlight your selection. Press the X button or the accelerator pedal to confirm your choice.



Quest Mode - Try to rise to the top by seeking out and racing rival drivers on Japan's expressways.

Free Run – Drive freely through the expressways.

Time Attack - Race through a particular course as fast as possible.

Versus Battle - Race against a friend (2 Player split screen).

Replay Theater – Watch your replay data in the theater.

System - Change game settings, key assignments, load and save games.

QUEST MODE

STARTING A GAME

New Game: After buying a car you are taken to the Garage, the main menu for this mode.

Continue Game: After selecting Quest at the main menu, select "Continue" to load your previously saved game.

LICENSE PLATE

Begin by selecting a location ID. Then select a 3 digit prefix number. Next you must choose the first symbol of your license plate number. This must be one of the characters in Hiragana. Then select 4 numbers of your choice to finish your license plate number. (If you want to use the default license plate that is displayed when you first get to the license plate screen, simply press the **START** button to bypass selecting any of the above mentioned). You can change your license plate within the Garage by selecting the Car Change option and pressing the button.



GARAGE

The garage is your "Home Base" in Quest mode, where you have the following options:

Course Select – Select the course.

Car Setting – Allows you to make adjustments to your car.

Tuning Shop – Allows you to purchase, install and replace parts for your car.

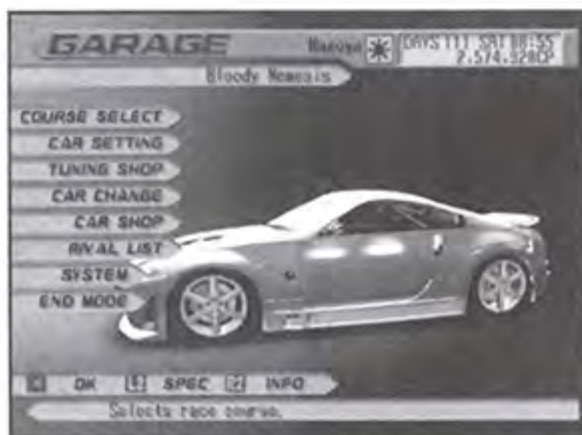
Car Change – Allows you to exchange your car and access the sub garage.

Car Shop – Purchase and sell cars.

Rival List – Displays information on the rivals you have encountered.

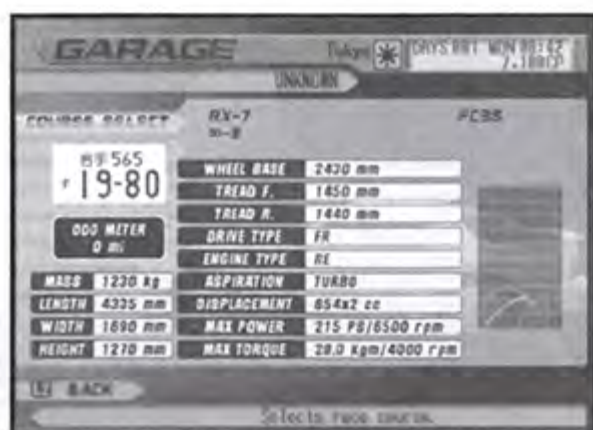
System – Allows you to save, load, and access options.

End Mode – Exits Quest Mode.



In addition to these selections, there is other information you should know about in your Garage:

You can press the L2 button to activate a detailed specifications display about your current car, and you can press the R2 button to display a User Information display. The User Information display shows how many races you've won, lost, drawn, your win average, max speed, speed rate (average speed), total mileage on your current car, and how many cars you have stored in your Garage. The Garage also displays the number of days you've raced in the upper right hand corner. This time may prove to be an integral prerequisite for racing later rivals.



BATTLE NAME

Your battle name is located in the upper left of your car display, and changes as you progress through the game. This is what the other drivers call you based on your driving style.

MONEY (CP)

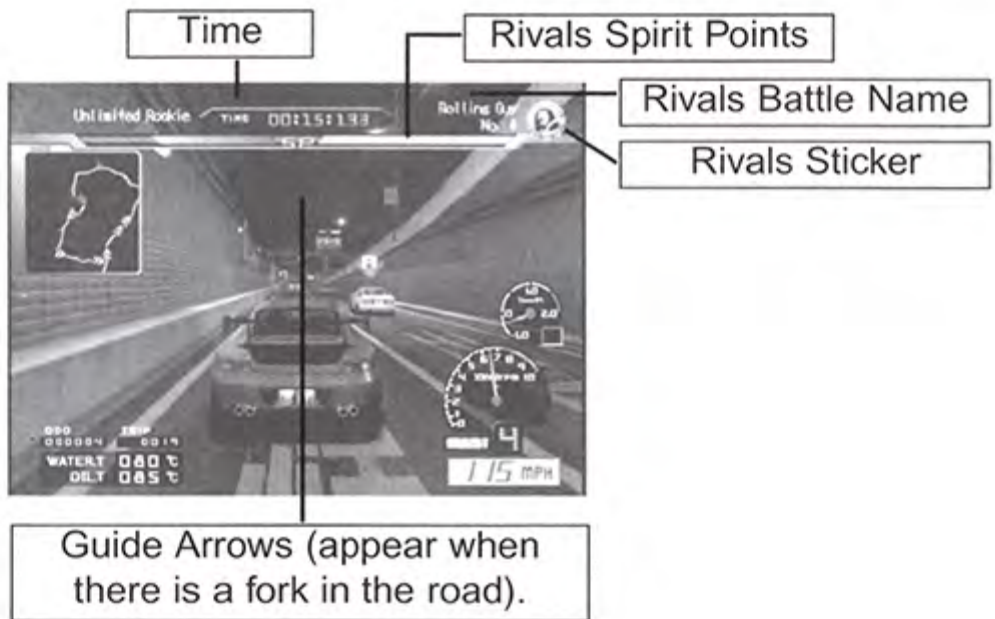
You gain money as you defeat rivals. You can use money to buy parts for your car, or buy a new car. The amount of money you have appears in the upper right corner of the Garage screen under the time and number of days you've raced.

STARTING A RACE IN QUEST MODE

From the Garage, select Course Select. Next you can choose where on the course you'd like to start, and in which direction. Make your choice, then select either Shift Assist ON, or OFF. Selecting ON will cause the car to shift automatically. Selecting OFF will require you to shift using the L1 button and R1 button on the controller. (Based on the Default control scheme)



New rivals are blue arrows, defeated rivals are green, the rival you are currently racing is red, and rivals that have defeated you or received a "Draw" are purple.



THE COURSE

When you initiate a new Quest, only the first section of the course is available to you. You can move to another city once you have defeated all of the rivals for your home base's area.



RACE RESULT SCREEN

After completing a race, the results of your race are displayed.

Rival's Prize – Amount awarded for defeating rival.

SP Prize – Amount awarded for remaining spirit.

Battle Distance – Amount awarded for battle distance.

Bonus – Bonus award for race completion, if applicable.

Win Combo Bonus – Bonus awarded for number of win combos, if applicable.

Total Prize – Total amount awarded for race.

Total – Current total amount.

After viewing the race results, you are given the following 3 options:

FREE RUN – Continue racing.

REPLAY - Watch a replay of your previous race.

REPLAY SAVE – Allows you the chance to save your replay data to playback in the Replay Theater.

PAUSE MENU OPTIONS

To pause the game, press the START button. A Pause screen will appear with the following options:

Continue - Resume game play.

Game Config – Adjusts roadmap size, course assistance, sub meters and vibration options.



Sound Config - Adjusts the sound effects and music volume levels.

Response - Adjusts the handling, acceleration and brake responsiveness.

Retire - Leave a race in progress (NOTE: This will result in a lost race for you).

Return to Garage - Leave the course and return to the garage menu.

DAILY RESULT SCREEN

After each racing session, you will be presented with the day's results.

Win – Displays number of wins

Lose – Displays number of loses

Draw – Displays number of races resulting in a draw

Average – Average win to loss ratio

Prize – Total amount won

Max Speed – Maximum speed reached while racing

Mileage – Number of miles traveled

Win Combo – Number of win combos

B.A.D. Name – Your battle name will change as you progress through the game.

CAR SETTING

In the Setting menu, you can adjust many aspects of your car for better performance. Move the sliders left or right using the directional buttons to make adjustments. Note: Some settings will not be available until you have upgraded certain parts of your car.

TEST RUN

Test your car's performance by selecting one of three short distance trials or race around the test track.



TUNING SHOP

In the Tuning Shop you can upgrade different parts for your car. From engines and mufflers to headlights and horns.

Power: Increase the horsepower of your car by upgrading the engine and exhaust.

Powertrain: Increase your engines' performance and overall stability of the car by upgrading your transmission, clutch and differential, suspension, as well as the brakes.

Tire/Wheel: Add various tires, and wheels to your car.

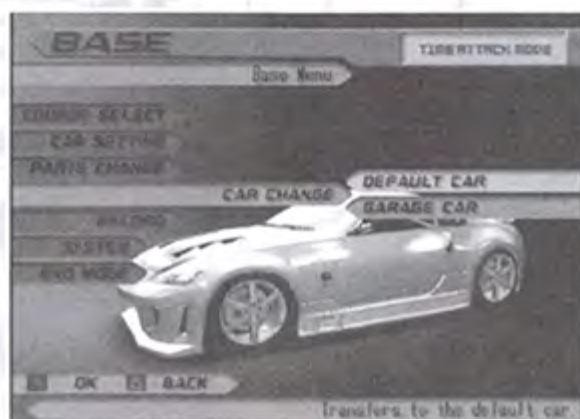
Body: Add stability to your car by upgrading roll cages.

Aero: Add various cosmetic parts to your car to lighten it and improve down force at high speeds.

Dress Up: Change the grill, headlights, taillights, signal lights, license plate position, gauges, horn, stickers and body paint of your car.

CAR CHANGE

The Car Change option allows you to change the car you are currently driving or load cars from your sub garage.



CAR SHOP

The Car Shop lets you buy new cars as well as sell old ones. To sell a car, you must have already purchased a new one.

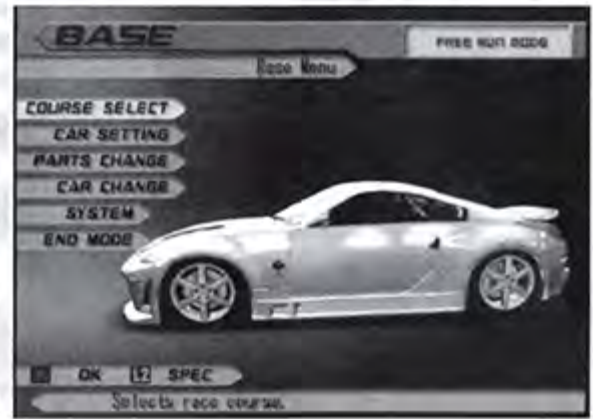


RIVALS LIST

In the Rivals database, you can view all of the rivals you've defeated in Quest mode, along with brief profiles on each of them by pressing the Square button. You can also view the profiles for rivals you haven't defeated as well. You can challenge any previously defeated rival by pressing the X button.

FREE RUN

This mode allows you to drive freely around Japan's Expressways. After selecting Free Run in the Mode Selection, you are taken to the "Base" screen (similar to the Garage), where you have the following options:



Course Select – Select the course.

Car Setting – Allows you to adjust the settings on your car.

Parts Change - Allows you to install and replace parts for your car you have already purchased.

Car Change – Allows you to select any car you have in your sub garage.

System - Allows you to save, load, and access options.

End Mode - Ends Free Run mode and returns to the Mode Selection screen.

VERSUS BATTLE



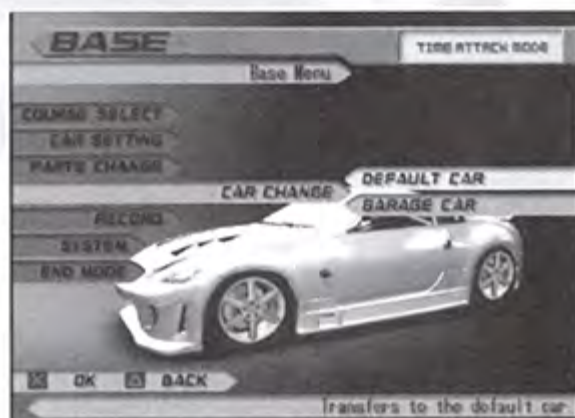
Versus Mode allows you to race against a friend in a split screen view. When you select VS. from the Mode select, you may load a previously saved game from your memory card. Player 1 loads their game first, then Player 2 can load their game. (NOTE: Player 1 always makes their selections first in VS. mode)

If you do not have a previously saved game to load, you are taken directly to the Manufacturer Selection screen where you can choose a car. Once both players have selected their cars, Player 1 can select where on the course to race. After Player 1 has chosen a location to start, both players are given the option to turn Shift Assist ON or OFF. After both players have chosen their shifting preferences, the race will begin.



(NOTE: Player 1's car always appears at the top of the screen, and Player 2's car always appears at the bottom of the screen.)

TIME ATTACK



Drive as fast as you can in various stages of the course. After selecting Time Attack from the Mode Selection screen, select a car and then you are taken to the 'Base' screen (similar to the Garage), where you can select the course you want to try.

REPLAY THEATER

Watch your replay data in the Replay Theater. You can change camera views and turn displays on and off while viewing replay data.

Controls:

Pressing the Δ button will toggle between alternate views. The X button returns the user to the Replay Theater. You can watch the replay from the beginning by pressing the L3 button. You can remove the HUD by pressing the SELECT button. Pressing the START button will pause playback.



SYSTEM

The following system settings will affect various aspects of gameplay. Once you have completed your changes, you can return to the Main menu.

Game Configuration – Adjust game options.

Sound Configuration – Adjust, BGM and SE volume and select BGM.

Response – Adjusts car handling.

Controller Configuration – Adjusts controller settings.

GT Force Configuration – Adjusts GT Force settings.

Save Game Data – Saves your current game to your memory card.

Load Game Data – Loads a previous game from your memory card.
